**Notes:**

Indoor water use restrictions: We decided this was too difficult to regulate without impacting the quality of life of individuals. Instead, we will place efforts into indoor water conservation education.

Municipal water use: Towns are committed to following general water restriction guidelines that are implemented for residents. Therefore, tree watering will follow the same guidelines as gardens. They have also committed to not planting new trees to reduce water use. Hydrants in Standard are also already limited to being flushed once in the Fall.
